On Tuesday, October 11, 2011, several members of the Penn State Club of Lancaster, sponsored a table at the Transitional Living Shelter (TLC) Banquet at The Eden Resort. To begin the night, Doug Hopwood, the Program Coordinator of TLC, provided an overview of how TLC assists members of the community in difficult times. The ultimate goal of TLC is to assist individuals and families with finding permanent housing. Several former and current residents spoke to the audience relaying how they came to need TLC's services, and how TLC has helped them, and continues to help them through temporary housing, learning budgeting and saving techniques, career skills, etc. One particular gentleman, who has a Bachelor's Degree and ten years of work experience, related that he moved to Lancaster County to be closer to his young son. He had several jobs lined up, but unfortunately they did not work out. He used his savings to stay at a hotel, while continuing to look for employment. When his savings ran out, he had no place to go and found himself homeless. He heard about TLC, and contacted them for assistance. He was placed in their program, and happily, he reported at the banquet, that he had just started a new job, and was planning on moving from TLC in the next few weeks. His story was just one of the few inspirational and positive stories heard that evening all of which are made possible by generous donations, numerous tireless volunteers and dedicated supportive staff.


